With the theme "Don't Just Survive. Thrive!" our first 2016 retreat, June 9-12, at Mar-Lu Ridge in Jefferson, Md., will emphasize living an abundant life, not just getting by from day to day.

"Many folks with HIV are living longer with better health, thanks to their meds, but they need a healthier mind and spirit, too, a love of life" said the Rev. Nancy Green, retreat director. A pastor and schoolteacher, she has been working at our retreats for 18 years, the last six as a director.

A Walgreens pharmacist who specializes in HIV will come share new wisdom on medicines and being consistent in one's self-care.

Other customary highlights will include: arts and crafts, small-group talks,

Our other 2016 retreats will be August 25-28 at

Manidokan Camp & Retreat Center in Knoxville, Md., and Dec. 5-8 at the Washington Retreat House in DC.

1st time to lead Walter Samuels,

who has co-directed several Ouality of Life Retreats as a trainee and attended many more, will take the reins for the first time in August. Once again a veteran retreatant becomes a retreat director, shouldering a big responsibility.

Walter, who has attended retreats since the mid-1980s and even paid for others to attend, often mentors first-timers.

Congrats and best

Our four retreats in 2015 succeeded in drawing 107 participants, most of them first and second-timers. Divided evenly between men and women, with four transgendered persons, most were African -American, over age 50, low-income, heterosexual and recently diagnosed.

The racial and age demographics represent a an established trend for **Ouality of Life Retreats** and our region.

Very few under 30

"We serve very few people under 30 anymore," said QLR's grant writer and researcher Lance Hogue, "but mostly those in the 40-69 age range." He cites the popular use of PrEP (Pre-exposure Prophalxis) and the drug Truvada by people under 30 with high-risk

behaviors trying to protect themselves from contracting the disease.

"Many in this age group don't know a world without HIV," said Hogue."They have accepted it and the stigma is not an issue for them."

More Hepatits C education added

There are also more people with a triple diagnosis of HIV, Hepatitis C and substance abuse. So QLR has added HEP C education to its retreat agendas.

And there are also more people caring for friends and family with HIV or working or volunteering in non-profit HIV agencies, added Hogue. "They often need respite themselves, compared with folks in earlier days who were in hospice and very sick themselves."

Late 2015 Retreats

The unthemed Dec. 7-10, 2015, retreat at the Washingon Retreat House, led by Judith Travers with 10 volunteer staff. welcomed 27 retreatants.

The August 2015 retreat, led by Malcolm Coley, drew 40 retreatants and staff to enjoy Manidokan **Camp & Retreat Center's** beauty and serenity.

Registrar Angel Ortiz has upgraded the application and notification process, while the board continues to update its forms. bylaws, rules and procedures.

"We're trying to keep up with trends occurring in HIV-AIDS and among our participants," said board chair Raymond Shattuck, "including what they need and want in education and support at our retreats, and what we can offer."
