

KEYNOTE EVENT ON SATURDAY, MARCH 4

This full-day event brings Dr. Phil Maynard, author of the book "Membership to Discipleship," to the Southern Region. Churches often think, plan, and function as though our ultimate goal is to add to the membership numbers, when in reality we have been given the mission to "make disciples" of Jesus Christ. This gathering of clergy and laity will engage in direct discussion with Dr. Maynard around the principles of this book, which provides theological understandings, structural frameworks, and practical ideas to assist churches in the work of disciple-making. Clergy and laity are strongly encouraged to attend together, as there will be table discussion relating to your team's own church context. This event will help your church develop a foundational plan to begin moving from a membership focus to discipleship development. The book is included in the registration fee if you have not already purchased it. Lunch is provided as well. Dr. Maynard is also the author of "Shift," which has been used in the Southern Region's training for Certified Lay Ministers. He has served as Director, Path 1 Coaching Network (Discipleship Ministries); Director, Excellence in Ministry Coaching (www.emc3coaching.com); and Director, Coach Training for Leaders (www.empowercoaches.com). Join the Conference Treasurer and Vanco as they focus a conversation on why this needs to be the year that your church implements electronic giving. Studies show that churches with electronic giving realize 26% greater total income that those accepting just cash and personal checks. BWC has only 87 churches with electronic giving That's less than 15% of our 640 churches and we are way behind in providing this ministry of stewardship for our congregations. To raise our sense of urgency, the Conference has negotiated a startup package with Vanco that eliminates all monthly fees for up to 2-years. The offer is good through June 2017. Big or small, please consider making this your Finance Committee goal in 2017!

DISABILITY MINISTRIES: AWARENESS, INCLUSION, PROGRAMMING (Southern B) - Instructor: Lisa Harvey

An advocate for the disabled, Ms. Harvey has been active in the disability community including testifying in front of the legislature in Annapolis. Deafened as an adult, she is the foster parent of 8 children, 5 of whom have disabilities. This workshop provides an overview of disability ministries; insight into various disabilities; common barriers to churches' inclusion of disabled persons; and ideas for establishing or enhancing a disability ministry at little cost. Will include brief discussion of Disability & the Law, as well as disability organizations & advocacy efforts. Participants will come away with at least 2 ways to improve accessibility in their ministry settings, as well as a better understanding of the definition and types of disabilities. Will be interpreted by signing.

YOUTH MINISTRY: GROWING LIFE-LONG DISCIPLES vs. "CHURCH MEMBERS" (Southern B) – Instructor: Rev. Dr. David Showalter and CCYM

For some time now, youth ministries and the larger church have been searching for ways to engage young people in ways that motivate them to connect and actively "live their faith" through their church community. In this session, we'll hear some of our local church's youth tell directly what leads them toward life-long discipleship vs. what causes them to feel uninvolved or even repelled. We'll discuss ways we might maximize on this knowledge, integrating the most recent youth culture research into what makes youth wish to become and remain active disciples through Christ's Church.

Specific, attainable goals then provide the direction and plan for both pastors and laity to move steadily forward in keeping with the stated vision. Hear how Brooks UMC has used this process of visioning & goal-setting, achieving remarkable growth in numbers and ministry, and recently completing a new facility for their growing worship and ministry. For pastors and laity alike, this class will help you in your own process of moving forward in your church's mission.

Social Media For Your Mission (Southern B) – Instructors: Melissa Lauber, Rev. Eric Alsgaard and Kat Bowling

So your church has a great sign, runs an ad in the local paper, and advertises in the Yellow Pages. The Yellow WHAT? In the 21st century, folks will get connected to your church and its ministries primarily through your website, Facebook, and other forms of social media. Social media and outreach technology are powerful tools for congregations, yet can be complex and seem out of reach for most churches.

Members of our Conference Communications staff, the Rev. Erik Alsgaard, Kat Bowling, and Melissa Lauber, will give insights on how to

use websites and other social media to share your church's mission, including the forms of technology likely to reach young adults. This class will also include a brief overview of the Baltimore-Washington Conference website (bwcumc.org), highlighting some of the features most helpful to congregations.

MISSIONAL CONNECTION IN THE COMMUNITY (Southern B) – Instructors: Sara Martin (Lexington Park UMC) and Rev. Pat Allen (Oxon Hill UMC)

The instructors will present two different models for churches to partner with helping agencies (both governmental and non-profit) to more effectively serve neighbors in need. One model from Oxon Hill UMC has the church serving as monthly host for the Youth Strategies & Reentry Services Section of the Prince George's County Department of Corrections to "set up shop" and provide resources and services to those released from prison/jail and any other person in need. This overlaps with a lunch "bread ministry" offered by the church on the same day. The other model from Lexington Park UMC has the church partnering with various community agencies through a referral system, which allows the church to play a substantial role as part of the larger support network working with persons for positive change in their living situations.
